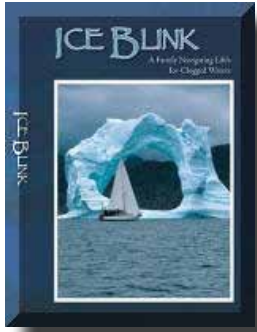

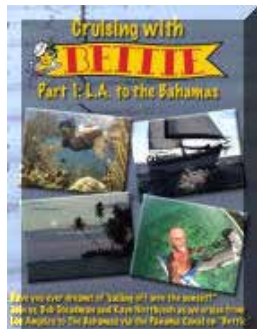
## Sailing

Dave and Jaja Martin have done all of this—and much, much more.”



### Cruising with Bettie 51:00

Join Bob and Kaye aboard their 36 foot sloop, “Bettie” as they cruise from Los Angeles to the Bahamas via the Panama Canal on the first leg of their sailing adventure. The Boat, “Bettie” is based on a Cascade 36 hull. It was custom molded for Bob by Yacht Constructors in Portland Oregon back in 1978. “Bettie” motors up river in Panama Four years and lots and lots of man hours later Bob splashed her. “Bettie” has a raised freeboard that allows for a flush deck design. This is a fast-paced documentary with gorgeous photography that will give you a first hand look at the cruising lifestyle. Panama Canal: last lock before the Caribbean Over 10,000 miles have passed under Bettie’s keel since Bob and Kaye left Los Angeles in 2004. They sailed down the west coast to Panama, through the Canal, east to Cartagena, Columbia then north to Honduras and east across the Caribbean to the Bahamas. That’s the focus of this video. Next, they cruised north along the eastern U.S. seaboard to Boston. The geese were flying south by October beckoning them back to warmer climes, so they headed south to Guatemala and Honduras . Refit After refitting and some time back in L.A., Bob and Kaye returned to the Caribbean. After cruising the U.S. East Coast once more then returning to Central America for a couple of winters, Bob and Kaye put “Bettie” up for sale. They now reside in Portland, OR aboard a new vessel.



### Dancing With The Wind (27:00)

Dancing With The wind tells the story of a 2-day cruise along Florida’s central Gulf coast that captures the romance and pure joy of sailing—without a word spoken. The melodies are composed and performed by sailor and professional musician, Ed Verner. 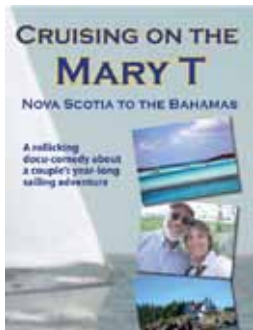


### WITH JEAN-DU-SUD AROUND THE WORLD 100:00

In attempting to sail non-stop between Saint-Malo and Gaspé through the Roaring Forties and around Cape Horn alone aboard his Alberg 30, Jean-du-Sud, Canadian Yves Gélinas added his personal share to the art of sailing a small boat around the world.

In addition to the voyage, his accomplishments included the design of a system to self-steer his boat, the writing of a book to document the voyage, and the shooting of a 16 mm film while sailing.

Even though Yves was unable to complete the circumnavigation non-stop, Jean-du-Sud was the smallest boat up to that time to sail that route. In acknowledgement, the Joshua Slocum Society International bestowed on Gélinas the Golden Circle Award.

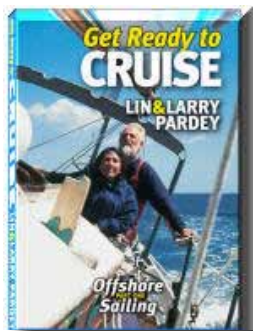
Along the way they encountered assorted equipment failures, made new friends, visited many interesting places, improved their navigational skills, and made this movie.

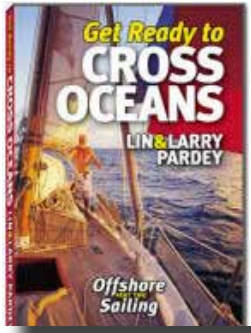

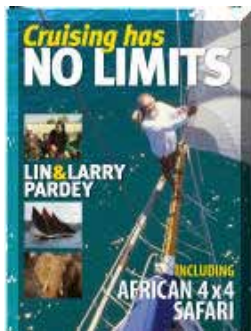


### Get Ready to Cross Oceans Off-Shore Sailing, Pt. 2; 90:00

## STORM TACTICS 84:00

“... I wanted to show how the sailor’s safety valve--heaving-to-works, and the slick it creates. It’s hard for people to imagine the almost magic effect of a slick as it saps the power of breaking waves....” - Larry Pardey

“One of the reasons I wanted to sail east-to-west around Cape Horn was to take video shots proving that small vessels can safely weather storms if they are well outfitted and efficiently handled,” Larry Pardey stated after his record-breaking voyage. Lin and Larry completed their against-the-wind rounding of the Great Southern Capes on board their > engineless 29-foot Taleisin, weathering nine days of storm-force winds to reach Puerto Montt in Chile. There they interviewed several high-latitude voyagers, prepared the narrative, and shot further detailed footage to complete the Storm Tactics video, a project Lin and Larry conceived almost ten years ago.

“Too many people see their cruising dreams derailed because of their fear of storms. We wanted to product a program that encouraged people by giving them a plan of action-one that showed storm sails working and a small boat coming through some major blows without drama or damage. Even more important, I wanted to show how the sailor’s safety valve--heaving-to-works, and the slick it creates. It’s hard for people to imagine the almost magic effect of a slick as it saps the power of breaking waves,” Larry says. “Now I have video to show it.”

When Lin and Larry began editing the final program in New Zealand, their work caught the eye of television director and editor Chris Gurr, who added his artistic talent to the project. Working with team New Zealand, Grant Dalton and the late Sir Peter Blake, Chris has created several award-winning sailing programs that have aired in eleven countries.

Additional footage for this 90-minute program has been provided by Australia’s WinzTV. Their dramatic images include aerial and off-the-boat views of small boats sailing in 70-knot winds (Force 12) in the Bass Straits, north of Tasmania. “It is important to encourage sailors to take a ‘can-do’ attitude when they encounter storm-force winds,” says cameraman Peter Harmsen, who was in the helicopter during the infamous 1998 Sydney-Hobart Race. “These pictures do just that.”

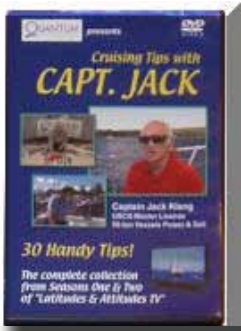
Figuring that many sailors will want to carry Storm Tactics on board and view it on their laptop computers, the Pardeys have produced the program in both VHS and DVD formats. “This program is designed to illustrate and expand on our Storm Tactics Handbook,” adds Lin. “We tried to add information and ideas we picked up from the folks we met at the bottom of the world.”

Besides actual storm tactics, the program includes information on securing gear, checking rigging, and gaining confidence before setting sail. The para-anchor setup is shown in detail for Taleisin as well as for modern boats, such as Beth Leonard and Evans Starzinger’s water-ballasted 47-footer, Hawk.

Lin and Larry Pardey have now voyaged more than 170,000 miles, including both east-about and west-about circumnavigations. They have made passages on 20 different boats, ranging in size from their own 24’ 4” and 29’ 6” self-built cutters through modern racing boats to 85-foot classic schooners. As Herb McCormick, editor of Cruising World puts it, “The Pardeys have received more awards for their pursuits than Tom Hanks has for his.”

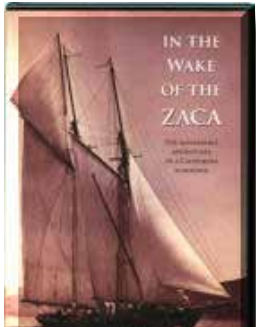
Editor and author Roger Taylor wrote that their Storm Tactics Handbook “could save lives and dreams.” Reviewers are now making similar statements about the graphic demonstrations of gear, tactics, and advice presented in the Storm Tactics video.

Storm Tactics was shot on location in Chile, South Africa, Cocos Keeling Atoll, Rio de Janeiro and Isla Grande, Brazil, and on the west coast of Ireland including Dingle, County Kerry, Kinvarra and Carraroe, County Galway. Lin and Larry used a Hi8 camera powered by two 13 watt solar panels connected to a 31 Amp gel-cell battery. Editing was done on an Avid suite onto Digibetacam stock using PAL format, then transferred to NTSC on a VISTEK system. The final NTSC program was compressed to DVD by RLX Video in Florida, USA.

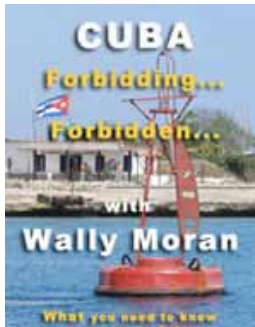


### In the Wake of the Zaca 51:00

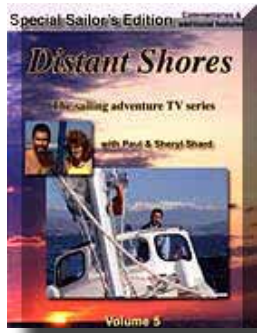
In episode 1, the Shards voyage north along the west coast of Turkey viewing ancient ruins and olive groves along the way. They take a Turkish bath in a natural hot spring “hamam” along the shore and visit a town on an inland lake. A trip to a barber becomes an enlightening experience when Paul discovers that Turkish barbers use flames as well as razors when he goes for a shave.

In episode 2, the Shards voyage north along the Turkish coast sailing up the Dardanelles, stopping at the Gallipoli War Memorial, and encountering a squall in the Sea of Marmara. They arrive in Istanbul and sail past famous monuments en-route to their base for exploring the old city.

In episode 3, the Shards begin their exploration of Istanbul from their base in Atakoy Marina. They visit the Grand Bazaar, one of the world’s oldest and largest covered markets. With local friends, the Shards learn about Turkish fashion, food, and night life.

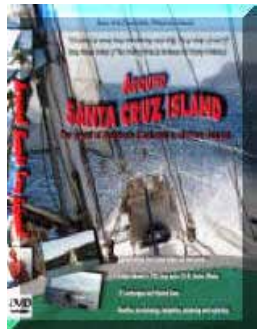
In episode 4, the Shards make landfall in Greece on the island of Lesbos, home of the Muses and poetess, Sappho. They visit the island’s two gulfs of Kalloni and Yeras, home to delicious sardines and olive oil. They visit the Mylelia water mill, where these two products are still produced in the traditional style. The Shards take a tour of the local church’s catacombs at Skopelos, and finally they participate in the Festival of Ay Marina.

In episode 5, the Shards continue exploring the island of Lesbos by traveling to the town of Plomari. Here they encounter many traditional festivals celebrating the heritage of the region. Plomari is the capital of ouzo, and the Shards arrive on the first day of the Annual Ouzo Festival where for four nights in July there

Crew - Around Santa Cruz Island Sail along with Captain Marc Hersh and his crew as they cross the Santa Barbara Channel aboard Songline, a beautiful J42 fitted out with all the cruising amenities. Then take a seat in the cockpit as the crew circumnavigates the Island, checking out some 15 pristine anchorages and taking day-hikes ashore.

#### The Island

Santa Cruz Island: Choches Prietos Positioned in the middle of the Channel Islands National Park 25 miles off the Santa Barbara coast, Santa Cruz Island offers its visitors 96 square miles of natural wonder. The largest of the eight Channel Islands, Santa Cruz is often referred to as "the Galapagos of North America." It's home to twelve species found no where else on earth and more than a thousand species of other plants and animals.
